When Opioid Pain Relievers Are Prescribed For Your Child: What You Should Know

Opioid pain relievers are most often prescribed following surgery or to treat cancer pain mostly for older people, less common to young people. However, if your child should have an accidental injury, tonsils taken out, oral surgery, ie. wisdom teeth removed, sickle cell disease, and other pediatric pain conditions, opioids can be prescribed for your child.

CBD (Cannabidiol): Potential Harms, Side Effects and Unknowns

SAMHSA (Substance Abuse Mental Health Service Administration) has issued a new advisory on "Cannabidiol (CBD) potential harms, side effects and unknowns". There are common misconceptions of about CBD. CBD has a broad availability and has been marketed for several medical conditions despite limited effectiveness. It is critical that parents in particular, should be advised to not let their children use non FDA approved CBD products. It has also been known to say on the package that there is not THC in the product but some may have traces of THC which will show up on an employment drug testing, jeopardizing many applicants without them even knowing.

What's in RI's Local Drug Supply

The Brown University research team tests drug residue samples from used paraphernalia collected at overdose hotspots and donated from individuals or community organizations across Rhode Island.

Brown University found that **44%** of street drugs contained Xylazine of the 90 samples tested.

Xylazine (Zi Lu Zeen) is a veterinary drug used for animals. It creates a deep long lasting sedation and is not a controlled substance and is not meant for humans.

It is becoming prevalent in Opioid overdoses found in fentanyl and pressed pills. Using xylazine extends the effect of fentanyl and heroin which has a rapid onset and short duration. Although Narcan reverses the effects of fentanyl it will not reverse the effects of xylazine, one has to pay special attention to the breathing. CPR will help until the person gets to the emergency room. Xylazine can cause serious soft tissue wounds and ulcers that can lead to infection.
